# **Sunday 9th June**

### A message from the leadership team

In my last ditty for the notice sheet, I talked about prayer: What makes a good one? How often should we pray? How persistent should we be?

But do you ever get despondent that your prayers seem to go unanswered? It can seem that at times God isn't even listening to us. For instance, we had been praying for Mary, my partner Ruth's mother for 3 months, that she would get the necessary operation to help her lead a normal life, but nothing was heard. Were we praying in the right way? Were we praying enough? Were we expecting too much of God? Undeterred, I decided to ramp up the prayer. Not in terms of trying to make it better (for God knows what is in our hearts before we say it), but the number of people praying simultaneously. So, on a Sunday 3 weeks ago, the Foundry lifted it up towards God (relatively unchanged).

And God listened. And God answered. And God acted. For by noon the following day, Mary had received a phone call telling her the operation would be that Friday. Co-incidence or Faith? It's easy to think the former but it's far more comforting to believe in the latter - that there is a Father looking after us. I have no doubt that He will answer prayer when the time is right. In this particular instance, it has shown me how prayer is magnified when we prayer specifically together. And if 25 people simultaneously praying can make a small difference, think of how powerful prayer can be if thousands, millions take part.

This Sunday is the culmination of Thy Kingdom come, nine days of simultaneous prayer across the world, Lighting up the World. I'm off to London after the service, to join thousands in Trafalgar Square celebrating Pentecost. Hopefully I'll see you there. And Mary? She's now home recuperating and all seems well. But the prayers don't stop......
