A message from the leadership team

Did you watch the recent BBC 1 series called Sacred Wonders? If you didn't, the programmes were about places around the world which are sacred to different religions and the extraordinary lengths people go to in order to fulfil what they perceive they have to do to enable them to gain favour with their God. Among the many and varied sites visited we saw a yearly "miracle" of holy fire from the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem, men climbing to the dizzy heights of the temples at Angkor Wat in Cambodia to keep the temples free from the encroaching jungle, a Buddhist monk performing incredible athletic feats which required hours of practice in order to become a fully-fledged monk, rites of passage of young Mescalero Apache girls which required two 13 year old girls to dance for hours on end. From China to Israel to Mali and Spain hours and hours of various endurance tests were carried out by the willing. It was very impressive and not a little scary to see these acts which brought great satisfaction to the participants.

Who am I to say whether God does or doesn't require such feats, although admittedly most did not involve Christians. But a small voice inside me says that the only commands that Jesus ever gave us were to love our God with all our heart soul and mind and to love our neighbour as ourselves, and he said that the only true way to God was through him. I can imagine to an outsider that might seem rather limp compared to all these daring and dangerous feats but to truly love and serve God and to truly love our neighbours as ourselves is actually a very hard ask. But it is what we are called to do, and whilst it requires much prayer and diligence we can all know the rewards in our hearts if not in the outside world. **Daphne Lander**
