A message from the leadership team

For a year now Trinity have been members of Woking People of Faith which is a charity that promotes 'community and religious harmony for the benefit of the public in Woking and environs'.

Last Saturday I went to an event organized by WPoF called "Who do we think we are?" About 30 people gathered together in the Community Centre in Sheerwater and we were allocated tables with a mix of different faiths to each table and told our stories of how we came to be in Woking. At the end of the afternoon amongst lots of other interesting information, we added up the accumulated miles and discovered that even with a relatively small number of people we had collectively travelled many times round the world.

On my table we had two Christians (Methodist and URC), a Jew and a Humanist. Our stories were very different - from coming to Woking for marriage or work, to racial cleansing and forced eviction from a mother country. Our conversations inevitably broadened as we talked about our Churches and approaches to belief and I thought about Trinity and our reluctance about talking to others about our faith. This was such a good forum for airing different viewpoints and I was reminded of a quote from an obituary I read last week of Professor Walter Hayman who said that he thought the world's religions were like the faces of a mountain, which grew more alike as they climbed closer to God. I certainly felt that on Saturday, realizing just how much we can share with people of different faiths and cultures. We can certainly learn from the commitment demonstrated by those of other beliefs as we strive to reach closer to our God.
