PRAYER:

We come before you, Loving Lord God; united in prayer, hopeful in uncertain times.

Hear us, hold us, heal us, help us, for in you we place our trust.

We offer you all that we are, all that we think, all that we feel... ...knowing that you understand and love us still.

Thank you for your promise to always be there for us. Amen.

BIBLE READING: ISAIAH 43:1-5a

'But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you.

Comfy, old slippers.... That fit us, perfectly... Moulded to the exact shape of our feet... Which make us feel 'at home'... We've travelled some miles together... They're always there for us... Welcoming us home – enfolding us. For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour. I give Egypt as your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you.
