

What is your favourite food? Pizza, cake, strawberries, bananas? We all have food we love to eat and also some food we are not too keen on. I'm not too keen on ginger, parsnips and carrots! But I know that some

people love them. But have you ever thought where your food comes from and how many people it takes to put food on our plate?

Just think about a chocolate digestive biscuit. Farmers sow seed to produce wheat, which then has to be harvested and turned into flour. Other famers rear cows to produce milk and butter. Cocoa beans are grown on the other side of the world



and shipped across the sea and turned into chocolate. Other make the biscuits in factories – packers put them in boxes and then drivers transport them to the shops. Shopworkers put them on shelves and the checkout staff serve us when we shop. I think we would be amazed at how many people it takes to produce and sell a packet of biscuits!

On Friday nights we often say 'Thank you' to God before we eat. Saying thank you is important, and it reminds us that God gives us so many good things. It's easy to forget sometimes how much we have to be thankful for. It tells us in the Bible that Jesus also thanked God for the food he ate. He is the perfect example of how we should behave.

Mark 6:8 So Jesus told the crowd to sit down on the ground. **After giving thanks**, he took the seven bread loaves, broke them into pieces, and gave them to his disciples.
