

Wey Valley Circuit Prayer Diary June 2025

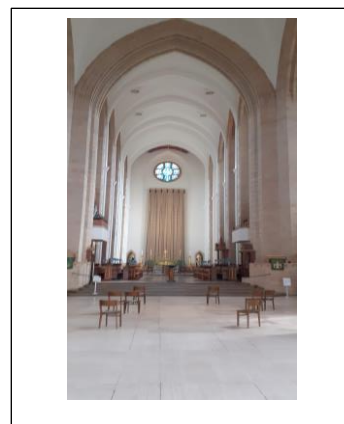

Sunday 1st – 7th Sunday of Easter – Eternal God, you have given all authority in heaven and on earth to your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Grant that I may never lose the vision of your kingdom but serve you with hope and joy through him who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen

Monday 2nd Food for thought – from [A Methodist Way of Life](#) – 'Notice'

Pray - Lord you are my light and my salvation; whom shall, I fear? You are the stronghold of my life; of whom should I be afraid? (from Psalm 27:1)

Reflect 'Where did you notice God last week and where might you notice God this week?'

Tuesday 3rd 'Tell' – Pray – Lord, I have your gospel to proclaim the good news for all – the gospel of a Saviour's name, to sing his glory, tell Christ's worth. (From StF 418 Edward Burns)

Lord Jesus help me this week to tell what I think of Jesus, a friend so strong and true, who changed my life completely, and did something that no other friend could do, No one ever cared for me like Jesus, there's no other friend so kind as He. No one else could take the sin and darkness from me, O how much he cares for me and you.

Wednesday 4th 'Worship' – *'I was glad when they said to me, "Let us go to the house of the Lord", (Psalm 122:1) and "Two men went up to the temple to pray (worship) one prayed thus – 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers or even like this tax-collector (then listed all the 'good things' he did, The tax collector, could not look up to heaven but was berating himself saying, God be merciful to me a sinner!'*

Reflect upon this parable and pray for yourself as the Spirit leads.

Thursday 5th 'Care' - Reflection and Prayer - Jesus is calling to us all, who call ourselves Christians, saying: When I need a neighbour, am hungry and thirsty, cold and naked, need a shelter, a healer, a friend - are you there?

For I the Lord of sea and sky, I have heard my people cry, borne my peoples pain, tended the poor and lame – have you responded? Here I am Lord, is it I Lord? I have heard you calling – I will go Lord, if you lead me. I will hold your people in my heart. *(From Matthew 25:31-40, Sydney Carter 256 StF, Daniel Schutte 663 Ibid,)*

Friday 6th 'Challenge' - Pray – Forth in your name, O **Lord I go**, my daily labour to pursue, you, only you resolve to know in all I think, or speak, or do. The task your wisdom has assigned O let me cheerfully fulfil, in all my works your presence find, and prove your good and perfect will. Give me to bear your easy yoke, and every moment watch and pray, and still to things eternal look, and hasten to your glorious day. Amen *(Charles Wesley Stf 550 vv 1,2,4)*

Saturday 7th 'Live' – Reflection – Don't assume that God's dismissed you from his mind, don't assume that God's forgotten to be kind; For no matter what you do, God's love still follows you, don't think that you have left God far behind. Don't assume you cannot give what God demands, Don't assume that God condemns you out of hand. For God gives to those who ask, grace for every task. Don't think that God will fail to understand. For God's love remains the same, God knows you by your name. Don't think because you failed God, God despairs. for God plans for you in love for and still cares. *(John Gowans, The Salvation Army Songs of Faith)*

Sunday 8th - Pentecost - Almighty God, who on the day of Pentecost sent your Holy Spirit on the disciples with the wind from heaven and with tongues of flame, filling them with joy and boldness to preach the gospel: send me out in the power of the same Spirit to witness to your truth and to draw everyone to the fire of your love.; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. *(MSB 545)*

Monday 9th 'Serve' – Lord take my life and use it to serve you. Take my time to share your love with the unloved. Take my hands to reach and touch the untouchable, Take my feet to walk the second mile with the disabled, Take my voice to express your love through practical advice and support with those who cannot speak for themselves. Take my wealth and help me to share it where it is needed. Take my intellect and show me how to use it to share your love in my thoughts, words and actions. Lord, here I am – take and use me to serve you unconditionally, empowered by the Holy Spirit! *(Based upon StF 566 and Isaiah 6:8)*

Tuesday 10th 'Share' – Reflection 'There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish - Jesus took the loaves and fish and shared them with the crowd – No one went home hungry! *(John 6:9)*

Prayer - Lord Jesus enable me to share love where there is anger and hatred, pardon, healing where there is injury, faith where there is doubt, where there is despair, hope, darkness light, sadness – joy. *(StF 707 from the Prayer of St Francis)*

Wednesday 11th 'Flourish': Reflect on - Lord, in the secret of your presence, where the pure of heart may dwell, are the springs of sacred service and a power that none can tell. There my love must bring its offering, there my heart must yield its praise, and you, Lord will come, revealing all the secrets of your ways.

Pray - 'Blessed Lord, to see you truly, then to tell as I have seen, this shall rule my life supremely, this shall be the sacred gleam. First to know you, then to serve you, that all may see you as you are. In the secret of your presence, in the sharing of your power, let me love you, let me serve you, every consecrated hour.

Thursday 12th 'Learn' – Pray – Teach me, my God and King, to see you in everything I do and say *(from StF 668,1 George. Herbert)*

Friday 13th 'Open' Reflect upon these 'openhearted/handed' responses and pray as you are led by the Spirit:

When it was evening, Joseph of Arimathea, went to Pilate to ask for the body of Jesus. Herod consented and Joseph, with support from Joseph of Arimathea, Mary Magdalene and another Mary took Jesus' body to the tomb Joseph had prepared for his own burial. (*The four Gospels*)

Now in Joppa there was a disciple named Dorcas/Tabitha. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity (*Acts 9:36a*).

In Phillippi, a certain woman name Lydia who was a worshipper of God was listening to Paul and Silas. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what they were saying and, with her household she became baptized. She invited Paul and Silas to come and stay at her home – which they accepted. (*Acts 16:13-15*)

Sunday 15th Trinity Sunday – Abba Father, you have created all things and through Christ revealed your salvation in all the world. Give me a vision of your glory and by your Holy Spirit fill me with life and love that I may praise and serve you through Jesus Christ my Lord, who is alive and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever Amen. Monday 16th [Refugee Week](#) begins – Reflection – Day One: - Joseph, Mary and Jesus - After the 'Wise Men' left an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt. (Matthew 2:13-14) How would you react in this situation?

Pray - for all those, for whatever reason, become refugees. It is a vast number to pray for.

This week, every day, think of a refugee or displaced person you may know, or a Refugee Aid organisation, and pray for them.

Tuesday 17th Day Two – Ruth – *'Naomi said to Ruth, See, your sister-in-law has gone back to her people and to her gods.; return after your sister-in-law. But Ruth said, Do not press me to leave you or turn back from following you! Where you go, I will go; where you lodge. I will lodge; your people shall be my people, and your God my God... So the two of them went on until they came to Bethlehem'* (Ruth 1:15-19a)

Wednesday 18th Day Three - Obi (Not his real name) Came into my Year Six class at short notice – he had come from Africa. His story is raw. He had been in his classroom working when guerrillas armed with machine guns opened fire and maliciously sprayed the children with bullets. Obi was sitting at the back and during the mayhem his table along with others was turned over and he was able to crawl behind it for shelter and was not noticed. All the other children were killed including their teacher. Obi waited until darkness and then climbed out of a window just behind him. He crawled back to his Grandma's house where she hid him, and contacted relatives in London who obtained documentation for him to go and live with them. Obviously, he was very subdued and edgy when he came, to us. Only the Head, the School Counsellor and I knew the full details. Obi transferred to Secondary School and made good progress.

Thursday 19th Day Four: I stood at the Bus Stop waiting to go home when a young lady, who I had taught a few years before, stopped to say hello. She and her older sister had come to London from Somalia as refugees from the fighting. She wanted to tell me that she had just been given an apprenticeship at a local Solicitors and hoped to become a lawyer. Her sister had qualified as a Doctor and was now a GP. It was such a pleasure to share in their success, considering their recent past.

Friday 20th World Refugee Day: Victor (not his real name) came to the school during Year Five. He had a wonderful smile and sense of humour to go with it. In year six he became the star of the Erd of Year Musical Production written by a local composer/playwright about David and Goliath. Victor had a small part as Goliath's servant and stole the show with his humour and play acting. The had the audience in stitches. The last time I saw him was when my daughter and I accompanied him home on the bus and he was met at the bus stop. We wished him well at his new Secondary School – he left us with a cheeky grin and a wave.

Shortly after he transferred to Secondary school I was called to see the Head as she had received a note from the Secondary School asking if we could urgently write a report about Victor, as they had heard the family were under threat of deportation. I did so that evening and passed it on. We heard from the Secondary School that our reports were being reviewed by the Immigration Office. Three days later I was informed by a very distressed Head, who was also a practicing Christian, that on the night before, Immigration Officers had broken into the accommodation and

arrested the family and within twenty-four hours they had all been deported. I have never heard what happened after. I often think of Victor and his joyful personality and remember him in my prayers.

Tuesday 24th Birth of John the Baptist - Read and reflect on these words by the Prophet Malachi, prophesying the coming of John the Baptist.: (*Malachi 3:1-3*)

See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple, The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight – indeed, he is coming says the Lord of Hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' 'soap' he will; he will sit as a refiner and purify of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offering to the Lord in righteousness,

Wednesday 25th With reference to yesterday's Reflection, Pray - Lord, purify my heart, let me be as gold and precious silver. Purify my heart let me be as gold pure gold.

Refiner's fire, my heart's one desire is to be holy, set apart for you, my Lord, ready to do your will, Lord. I choose to be holy, set apart for you, my Lord, Ready to do your will.
