Leadership notes:-

Last Sunday we held our Nativity service - a tradition in many churches at this time of year. Saint Francis is credited with the first living nativity scene in Greccio, Italy on Christmas Eve in 1223. Having been given permission by the Pope, he used real people and animals in a cave to help the local people connect with the humility of Jesus's birth.

Next week we will be taking some of our grandchildren to the Wintershall Nativity - an immersive experience on a winters evening where we will stand with the shepherds in the field, walk with Mary, Joseph and the donkey, journey with Roman soldiers and at the end of the evening, enter a stable to gather around the manger. Perhaps a little more realistic than the tea-towelled shepherds, tinselled angels and cuddly toy sheep we see in church at Christmas, but even then, still very far removed from the reality of the birth of a baby in an animal shelter, by a young unmarried girl and her fiancé Joseph - both probably worried and uncertain what the future might hold. And then, with the threat to the life of their little boy hanging over them, having to flee to a foreign country as refugees. The wonder of the birth of a child in the harsh reality of life.

In the telling of the birth of Jesus we cannot accurately recreate those events of just over 2000 years ago, but what we can do is to pass on the story from generation to generation. The youngest child can recognise the love of a parent and the giving and receiving of gifts, and hopefully understand something of the wonder of the story, and those of us who have sat through many a Nativity can ponder again the mystery of God touching earth from Heaven in the form of that little, tiny, vulnerable child - a gift of love like no other.




