Message from the Leadership Team (LT)

On Monday 9th February we have our next Church Council meeting.

A church runs as a Charity, and as such it must have Trustee's. In a Methodist Church these are certain office holders (e.g., the Stewards) plus congregational representatives who are voted into the role at the Annual Church Meeting. So, on Monday the Church Council, legally the most important meeting at Trinity, meet to receive reports and make decisions on Trinity's future. If you have a concern or idea you want raised, then write a letter to Church Council or speak to one of the representatives.

A significant part of a CC meeting is taken up with necessary business - Finances; Property; Reviewing and renewing policies; Receiving reports on what is going on. We vote to accept reports, and vote on any proposals that are tabled. Generally, these are the things that the Charities Commission is interested in. They want to know that we are financially sound and only using the monies donated for the declared purposes of the Charity. You'd be surprised what we can't do, even if we think it is 'our money'!

Each meeting has a set of minutes produced. The minutes of the CC are an important document - the history of Trinity is contained in the back copies of our CC minutes. Reports will contain a record of what has happened in all areas of the church life, but it tends to be of a factual rather than spiritual nature. And that is a fair reflection of the meetings - a church the size of Trinity has a lot of 'business' to deal with in what we aim to be a 1.5hour meeting.

You might question where we deal with the more spiritual side of the life at Trinity? Well,, it is not ignored. The meeting starts with an opening devotion and closes with a prayer. Occasionally, when there is a challenging topic that we have discussed, we may break off and pray about it, but in reality we are time limited and there is not time in the meeting for deep theological consideration and prayer.

So, when do we pray about the life of our church? That is a very good question, but it's one I want to cast out into the wider reaches of Trinity. Those who attend CC give up their time to take part in what is essentially a business meeting. *[continued over.....]*

World Day of Prayer


Friday 6th March 2026




Speaker: Grace Pratt Morris-Chapman
