Message from the Leadership Team (LT)

Three weeks ago, I went back to Epping, in Essex to the church I grew up in to attend their 400th Anniversary service of worship on the same site. Formerly a Congregational church, it had become Epping URC in 1972. Much had changed since I left. The church building where I had been baptised, attended Sunday School and Youth Group, became a Christian and was married, was no longer there. The financial upkeep had been unsustainable and so it had been knocked down and that part of the site sold and redeveloped. What was once the church hall, is now the Sanctuary, with a newer suite of rooms built over recent years. We didn't expect to know any of the congregation either - and we didn't as I left 43 years ago, and my parents moved away 36 years ago, yet it still felt like a 'coming home.' So, it was a lovely surprise to find 3 friends from our old Youth Group who had also come back for the service. We were instantly transported back to the 1970s where, as teenagers, we had spent so much time together and many memories were shared!

But what struck us about the Church was the 'looking forward'. The small congregation, like many churches has had its challenges, but was so enthused and excited about focusing on its Mission, sharing the Gospel Good News and serving the community now and in the future.

Next weekend as we celebrate the 60th anniversary of worship and service in this building there will also be much looking back, perhaps with nostalgia, and celebrating all that has been. But with equal measure we have so much to look forward to. God has a plan for us - He is not done with us! And that is exciting!

I am so thankful for the Church in Epping and its people who helped shape my faith and my life – perhaps not often realising, as the Church navigated the 'day-to-day' and 'ups and downs' of life, that each were playing their part in building God's Kingdom in that place. Just as we are doing here at Trinity, now, and in the years to come. And what a Blessing that is!

Trinity Methodist Walk in the Surrey Hills Saturday 31st May 2025


The church walk in the Surrey Hills took place on Saturday 31st May 2025. Seven walkers from the Trinity congregation attended. The route started in the Abinger Roughs and included an ascent of the North Downs (Blatchford Down), where there were spectacular views across the valley towards the Greensand Hills. We paused here for a rest and to take some drone photos of the group and the surrounding countryside. The route then continued eastwards along the North Downs Way. After crossing White Down Lane, we investigated an old chalk quarry- a relic of Surrey's industrial past. Some of the group left us at this point and the rest continued eastwards along the North Downs Way. When we reached Pickett's Hole and a WWII pill box, we turned right and began our descent of the Downs, along a line of ancient yew trees. There were spectacular views here along the line of the Downs towards Ranmore Common and Box Hill. After crossing the railway we reached a cluster of farm building, where we turned right and continued along a low level path to the starting point in the Abinger Roughs. The late May weather was gloriously sunny and there were orchids on the chalk downlands and white elder flowers in the hedgerows. Hopefully another walk will be arranged over the Summer, weather permitting.
