## Message from the Leadership Team (LT)

Last week, I travelled to the Loire Valley in France, where I had the opportunity to visit various châteaux and gardens. Among the many beautiful sites we explored were Le Clos Lucé, known as the final residence of Leonardo da Vinci, and the gardens of Chateau Villandry - reputed to be the most beautiful in France. The experience of wandering through these historic locations offered both aesthetic pleasure and moments of contemplation.

It was fascinating to observe the behaviour of my fellow travellers during the holiday. Although the majority of my companions would not describe themselves as religious, there was a clear interest in visiting Tours Cathedral. This was not something I had expected. Our guide arranged for us to visit the Cathedral. However, when we arrived, we found that a funeral service was about to begin. As a result, we were unable to enter the cathedral at that time. Later, when we were granted some free time to explore the area independently, most of our group chose to return to the cathedral. This experience led me to reflect on what it is that attracts people to places like cathedrals, even if they do not consider themselves religious. I believe it is the sense of peace and quiet that these spaces offer—a reassuring atmosphere that suggests all is well. There is a feeling that God is present with us, even if we are not consciously aware of it.




## Help needed!

The day will involve group and individual work


- · writing lyrics and music


