Message from the Leadership Team

Last Saturday we had a very enjoyable mission supper organised by the circuit mission group. The speaker was Trey Hall the Director of Evangelism and Growth in the Methodist Church. He talked about actively planning our mission as a church and Rev Paul Glass gave some examples of missional activity by churches in the circuit which fitted with their situation e.g. West Horsley ran a crib service at Christmas and invited the local primary school.

'A mission plan is simply a plan of action saying what the church will do in the next year or 18 months to reach their community with God's love. A mission plan should show a desire for more people to:

- explore faith and encounter grace
- come to a living faith in Jesus Christ
- grow in faith and discipleship
- become committed members of your church.

This is not to ignore the challenges or to reduce mission to an obsession with numbers. Instead it is an attitude of praying, looking, hoping and working for transformation which goes beyond Sunday morning worship attendance.' (Taken from Our Church's Future Story Guidance and resources for mission planning).

A really useful plan will include concrete actions and specific goals. As a church there are many ways that we already work in mission e.g. we take chocolates and give them out to passers by at Christmas with a message of invitation from the church. I wrote last time about asking the groups who hire our church if they would like us to pray for them and if there was anything specific? Have any of us done that yet? What more could we be doing as a church to increase our mission and evangelism and reaching out? Please let me know and the Leadership Team will help you realise them.

How do you show love - to people you know or people you have never met?


Prayer – Help me to be ready to show Your love to my 'neighbour' Amen.
