Thursday 1st Jesus said - 'Come to me, all you that are weary and carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest.' (*Matt 11:28*} Share, with the Lord, your burdens, and those you know who are weary and heavy laden.

Friday 2nd Pray for the Mission and Ministry of Chaplaincy across the Circuit, in Hospitals, Care Homes, Schools, the University, other Colleges and locations. Pray for the Holy Spirit to work through them as they reach out to serve the needs of those in their care.

Monday 5^{5h} Pray for the Ministry and Mission of Bible Study, Prayer and House groups in your church, and across the Circuit.

Tuesday 6th Hiroshima Day: Pray for all those who suffer in times of war, for peace and security, particularly at this time.

The Transfiguration of Jesus – give thanks that Jesus became human – yet divine, to save us from our sins and bring us forgiveness, assurance and spiritual peace. Commit yourself to serve our Lord in whatever way you are called.

Wednesday 7th Pray for the Ministry and Mission of Coffee and Chat 10.30am – 12 noon (Weekly) at Woking Trinity and other similar groups supporting Elders, the lonely, and the isolated, across the Circuit.

Thursday 8th Jesus said to his disciples , 'Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while' (Mark 6:31) Find a quiet place today, rest, and share time with Jesus.

Friday 9th Pray for those you know who are on holiday or travelling. That they may have journeying mercies, a restful time and find God's presence and peace. Pray too for those who are unable to go on holiday, particularly children, and the agencies, eg Action Aid for Children and Salvation Army who provide holidays, and food, for children and families out of term time.

Saturday 10th The end of the week – Lord Jesus, now the week is over, I am weary and seek your comfort and solace. Be with me tonight and bless my sleep and prepare me for the coming week. *(Based on words by Sabine Baring-Gould 944 MHB)*

Sunday 11th Pray for the Worship, Ministry and Mission at Addlestone 10.30, Cranleigh 10.30, West Horsley 10.00, and all who participate.

Monday 12th Pray for those who cannot afford to take a holiday that they may find opportunities to have a 'break'.

Tuesday 13th Pray for all the work with children and young people across the circuit, that God may bless them and lead them to a strong relationship with Jesus. Pray for the leaders, give thanks for their commitment, especially those who will be working with the children over the holidays, that they may have a break to recharge.

Wednesday 14th Reflect on 'God doesn't come and go. God lasts. Our God doesn't get tired out, doesn't pause to catch breath. Our Abba Father knows everything, inside and out. God, the Holy Spirit energizes us when we get tired and gives us fresh strength. Those who wait upon God get fresh strength'. (From Isaiah 40:27-31 amended The Message) Pray as the Holy Spirit leads.
