This month's prayers are based on the theme of The Advent Hope - the coming of Immanuel – God with us – Jesus the Son of God; World Aids Day; Christmas and Peace

Monday 2nd



Bristol Cathedral Reflect upon the faith of Mary and Joesph in their response to God's Call. The birth of Jesus, the Messiah, took place in this way. When his mother Mary, was engaged to be married to Joseph. Before they came to the marriage bed Joseph discovered she was pregnant,

(It was by the Holy Spirit, but he didn't know that) Joseph, chagrined but noble, determined to take care of things quietly so Mary would not be disgraced.

While he was trying to figure a way out, he had a dream. God's angel spoke in the dream: "Joseph, Son of David, don't hesitate to get married. Mary's pregnancy is Spirit conceived. God's Holy Spirit has made her pregnant, She will bring a son to birth, and when she does, you, Joseph, will name him Jesus –'God saves' – because he will save his people from their sins. "

A prophet said, *Watch for this – a virgin will get pregnant and bear a son; they will name him Immanuel – 'God is with us'*

Then Joseph woke up. He did exactly what God's angel commanded in the dream: He married Mary. But he did not consummate the marriage until she had the baby. He named the baby Jesus. (*Matthew 1:18-25 The Message*)

Go down in the city, into the streets, and give the message to the people you meet. Through prayer – Light up the fire of the Spirit and let the flame burn, open the door, let Jesus return. Take seeds of his Spirit, let the fruit grow, tell the people of Jesus, let his love show,

Pray that the Holy Spirit will lead and enable you to share this message of Hope with others.

Wednesday 11th

Go through the park, on into the town; the sun still shines on; it never goes down. The light of the world is risen again; the people of darkness are needing a friend. Open your eyes, look into the sky, the darkness has come, the sun came to die. The evening draws on, the sun disappears, but Jesus is living, his Spirit is near. Pray for the faith and courage to spread the gospel in words and deeds. wherever you are.

Friday 13th On the day when there is a tendency for flippancy and superstition reflect on these words and the reality of God's presence every day whatever may happen.

Light of the world you stepped down into darkness, opened my eyes, let me see beauty that made my heart adore you, Hope of a life spent with you, So here I am to worship, here I am to bow down, here I am to say that you're my God, and you're altogether lovely, altogether worthy, altogether wonderful to me. Martin Luther after seeing stars shining through the branches of the fir trees on his way home from church prompted him to take one into his church on Christmas Eve and put candles on it to celebrate the coming of the Light of the World to give the light and love of God to the world.

Saturday 28th Holy Innocents –If possible, read Matthew 4:16-18 or StF 218 (*Fred Kaan*) particularly v3 It is not a surprise that Herod acted in that way, We are experiencing similar actions across our world today and it is always the young, frail, and vulnerable who suffer the most. We all have a responsibility to seek for peace in all areas. In the quiet wherever you can find a copy of StF 712 - meditate and reflect on the words and pray to the 'Prince of Peace' verse five, for yourself and everyone you know and the whole world.

Put Christ into each other's hands, he is loves deepest measure; in love make peace, give peace a chance and share it like a treasure (StF 712 Fred Kaan)— make it a personal challenge for the New Year to think, speak and act in peace in yourself and all you meet.

- 3. Tannenbaum = Christmas Tree it was introduced into Britain by Queen Charlotte, King George III's wife, and erected in the Palace at Kew. Following on from the example of St Nicholas she asked all her heads of department to make a list of those who worked under them and any retired who lived on the Estate and a suitable present was placed around the tree for everyone and distributed at the 'Christmas Party'. This happened every Christmas until the end of her reign. Prince Albert revived the concept at Windsor Castle after his marriage to Queen Victoria it was quickly copied by members of the Royal Court and very soon became part of our Christmas traditions
- 4. Wilderness of Judea, clothing camel's hair with a leather belt, food locusts and wild honey
- 5. Micah Micah 5:2-3
- 6. Good King Wenceslas, his page, the poor man, and you (*Therefore, Christian folk those of you who bless the poor shall yourselves find blessing*)
