Thursday 1st May Day – The Traditional Festival to celebrate the coming of Summer – In the light of Climate Change reflect on these words by Eleanor Farjeon (*StF 136*):

Morning has broken like the first morning; blackbird has spoken like the first bird. Praise for the singing! Praise for the morning! Praise for them, springing fresh from the Word!

Sweet the rain's new fall sunlit from heaven, like the first dewfall on the first grass. Praise for the sweetness of the wet garden, sprung in completeness where his feet pass. Mine is the sunlight! Mine is the morning born of the one light Eden saw play! Praise with elation, praise every morning, God's re-creation of the new day. Pray as the Spirit leads.

Friday 2nd God's free mercy streams over all the world, and God's banner gleams everywhere unfurled. Broad and deep and glorious as the heavens above, shines in might victorious - God's eternal love. (William Walsham How)

Pray for all those who seek to serve the Lord and share God's love across the world – name before God any that you know.

Saturday 3rd Lord, upon my blindness your pure radiance pour; with your loving-kindness make me love you more: When the clouds are drifting dark across the sky, light of light shine o'er me on my pilgrim way, going still before me to the endless day. (Ibid)

Sunday 4th - 3rd Sunday of Easter, – Lord Jesus my friend, you ask for my love in spite of my failings. Give me courage to embrace your forgiveness, to know you again, and trust myself in you; I pray in your name. Amen. *(from MWB p541/20)*

It is Vocations Sunday – vocation – 'A calling by God to God's service in special work, or position, or to a state of salvation; a way of living or sphere of activity to which one has been called to by God' (From Chambers Twentieth Century Dictionary p1519).

Give thanks and pray for the Pastoral Visitors, Stewards, Administrators, Musicians, Readers, Flower Arrangers, Refreshment Providers, any other Volunteers and all those who Worship in the Churches or online, including yourself. Amen.

Monday 5th Pray for the Ministry and Mission of Chaplaincy across the Circuit, in Schools, the University, other Colleges, Hospitals, Care Homes, HMP Send and any other locations you know; that they may be filled by the Holy Spirit as they share the love of Jesus who by his death and resurrection brings, love, hope and new life for those they meet.

Tuesday 6th Live by the Spirit

(If possible, read Galatians 5:16-26 and reflect upon its relevance to yourself)
The Fruits of the Spirit - love, joy, peace...

Wednesday 7th patience, kindness, generosity...

Thursday 8th faithfulness, gentleness and self-control...

Friday 9th There is no law against such things, and those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If you live by the Spirit, seek be guided by the Spirit. Amen

Saturday 10th Pray for the Ministry and Mission of the Plant Sale for Christian Aid at Woking Trinity 10,00 am – 12.00 noon.

Sunday 11th 4th Sunday of Easter – Lord Jesus, Good Shepherd of the sheep, by whom the lost are sought and guided into the fold: feed me and I shall be satisfied ; heal me and I shall be made whole; and lead me, that I may be with you; for you are alive and reign with Abba Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen. *Ibid 542:21*

John Haine, Methodist Itinerant 1708-1784 - It is to you, O God of glory, that I come. It is on your mercy that I rely, It is to you, O Lamb enthroned, that I draw near, in your salvation, that I trust, on your peace that I rest. (MPH p 14)

Tuesday 13th Walter James, Wesleyan Minister 1879-1908 – Let me love your holy word, O God, anxious to obey its commandments, eager to comprehend its meaning, longing to be guided by its precepts, yearning to hear the voice that speaks through its pages. (MPH p 24))

Wednesday 14th Matthias the Apostle – After Jesus had ascended - 'When the Apostles returned to Jerusalem from the Mount of Olives, they went to the Upper Room. Peter suggested that a substitute should be found to replace Judas. Peter stipulated that they should be someone who had been with Jesus from the beginning of his Ministry. So, Joseph Barsabbas, known as Justus and Matthias were recommended. Then they prayed and asked the Lord to show them – by casting lots. Matthias was chosen as the twelfth Apostle. (From Acts 1:21-26)

Thursday 15^{8h} Reflecting on Matthias' position Pray -Give me the faith which can remove and sink the mountain to a plain, give me the childlike praying love, that longs to build your house again; your love, let it my heart o'erpower, and all my simple soul devour. (Charles Wesley Stf 661:1)

Friday 16th Reflect as above; and pray – My talents, gifts and graces, Lord, into your blessed hands receive; and let me live to preach your word (*in words and actions*) and let me to your glory live; my every sacred moment spend in publishing the sinners' friend. (*Ibid 661:3*)

Saturday 17th Pray for the Mission and Ministry and Clothes 4U at Knaphill 2.00 pm-4.00 pm, and Songs of Praise – West Horsley 7.00pm

Sunday 18th 5th Sunday of Easter Loving and eternal God, through the resurrection of your Son, Jesus, help me to face the future with courage and assurance, knowing that nothing in life or death can ever part me from your love for me, in Jesus Christ our Saviour, who is alive and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen *(MWB p542:12)*

Pray for the Worship, Ministry and Mission at Cranleigh 10.30am, Godalming 10.30 am, Guildford St Mary's 8.00am and 10.30am, West Horsley 10.00 am, Weybridge 10,30an, and all who participate.

Monday 19th John Fletcher, John Wesley's designated successor 1729-85 – Let me depend above all things, O Christ, on your grace, desire in all things your love, rejoice at all times in your presence and delight through all undertakings in your glory. (MPH p34)

Tuesday 20th Mary Porteous, Primitive Methodist Itinerant 1783-1061 *Let me be lost in your will, O God, lost in the doing of it, lost in the presence of your Spirit, lost in your redeeming love and lost in you forever, Amen (MPH p76)*

Wednesday 21st Charles Wesley's Pentecost – Long my imprisoned spirit lay fast bound in sin and nature's night; Thine eye diffused a quickening ray – I woke, the dungeon flamed with light; My chains fell off, heart was free, I rose, went forth and followed thee. (StF345).

Friday 23rd Pray for the Street Angels in Woking, Guildford and elsewhere that the love, light, power and hope of Abba Father, Son and Holy Spirit will shine through them and bless their commitment to serve. Give them strength and security at this sometimes-difficult time. Amen

Saturday 24th Wesley Day 'O how shall I the goodness tell, Father, which you have shown to me? That I, a child of wrath and hell, I should be called a child of God. Should know, should feel my sins forgiven, blest with the antepast of heaven!

O God what offering shall I give to you, the Lord of earth and skies? My spirit soul, and flesh receive a holy, living, sacrifice, small as it is, tis all my store; more would you have, if I had more. Lord, arm me with your Spirit's might, since I am called by your great name; in you let all my thoughts unite, of all my works be you the aim: your love attend me all my days, and my sole business be your praise (StF 562 vv1, 5)

Thursday 29th Ascension Day - Almighty and everlasting Abba Father, you raised our Lord Jesus Christ to your right hand on high. As we rejoice in his exaltation, fill us with his Spirit, that we may go into all the world and faithfully proclaim the gospel. This we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God now and for ever and ever. Amen. *(MWB 544/5)*

(Ibid StF 564 vv 3-4)

As you journey into next month - reflect on these words of Charles Wesley and pray...

'Forth in your name, O Lord, I go, my daily labour to pursue, you, only you, resolve to know in all I think, or speak or do. The task your wisdom has assigned O let me cheerfully fulfil, in all my works your presence find, and prove your good and perfect will. (*StF 550 v1*)
